Fueling the Future Through Idea Exchange

On November 29, 2023, the Coalition's Phase 5 peer exchange brought together member states to discuss sustainable funding for transportation. This was the second peer exchange the Coalition has conducted on the topic, and it included Phase 4 participating states as well as those planning to partner in future phases. The daylong event provided a platform for agencies to share their experiences and discuss what works, what does not, and what can be adapted from other states' experiences. The goal was that participants could leave with specific next steps for their state/agency in the realm of sustainable funding for transportation.

The peer exchange offered a valuable opportunity for states to hear directly from each other. Participants were eager to learn about defining and describing the funding problem, collaborating with DMVs and tolling authorities, and the practical aspects of implementing and enforcing an MBUF program.
